SKYLAB: A Multi-Million Dollar  
Piece of Garbage...

Once again another disaster is  
about to happen: Skylab, a multi-  
million dollar piece of garbage will  
hit the earth. Skylab is America's  
first orbiting laboratory launched  
on May 14, 1973. 11 days later, the  
first of 3 scheduled manned mission  
performed a rendezvous with a space  
station activating its extensive  
facilities. These were set up to  
conduct solar experiments and to re-  
information on earth's ecological  
systems, and to study weightlessness  
on industrial processes.

Most important were the medical &  
and life science information obtain-  
ed from the three man crews as they  
lived in space for prolonged periods  
of time.

The first Skylab mission lasted  
28 days; its success prompted NASA  
to extend Skylab III's mission,  
(launched in July of 1973) to 59  
days. A third and final Skylab mis-  
sion was launched in November of  
1973 and the crew spend 84 days in  
space.

But now it is coming in towards  
earth and will probably crash between  
July 5th and July 20th. For all we  
know Skylab could land in Australia  
or on the Waupaca Golf Course.
