OLYMPICS - 1968

- 9:30 Opening ceremonies. Nations mass at athletic field, march to the waterfront with flag bearer in single file. Unfurling of flags, description of Olympic traditions, taking of Olympi oath and lighting of Olympic torch. Commencement of Olympic games.
- 10:00 Riflery four man teams; i target of five shots per man; places determined by total team scores. Individual and team winners.

Archery - three man teams; one target of five arrows per man; places and winners as in riflery.

Marathon Relay - five man relay team to run 1/5 of a mile each. Four races involving two nations each; final places determined on the basis of time.

Pentathlon - one man from each nation to compete in the following five events: riflery, archery, cross country run, 120 yard free style swim and the hammer throw. points determined by placement in each event.

Golf - two man teams; four wholes per man; places determined

by final total score for each nation's team.

11:00 Rowing - a] 2 rowers with coxswain b] single rower all craft races shall be between 2 nations and shall be timed; winners and places determined on the basis of time. Canoeing - a] 2 paddlers b] single paddler. See above. Junior Relays - variety of relays for the youngest five members of each nation. Final places determined by results in all relays.

Sports Skills - two men teams to compete in basket shooting, throwing speed, punting distance and base-running; total

points for each team determines final placement.

- Track Pentathlon one man from each nation to compete in the following five events: long jump, 12" ball throw, shot put, 50 yard dash, 440 yard run; final points by placement in events.
- Track and Field each nation to be divided into 3 divisions. 2:30 one athlete from each division in 50 yard dash, long jump, high jump, ball throw and 220 yard dash; also All-Nation Shuttle Relay and Tug-O-War.
- Swimming each nation has one entrant in the free-style, 3:30 breast-stroke, and back-stroke plus a 3-man medley relay team. There will also be an all-nation free-style relay. Relays based on timing.

All events except the two all nation relays are equal in 10-8-7-5-4-3-2-1. point value:

The two all nation relays are scored:

20-16-14-10-8-6-4-2.
