

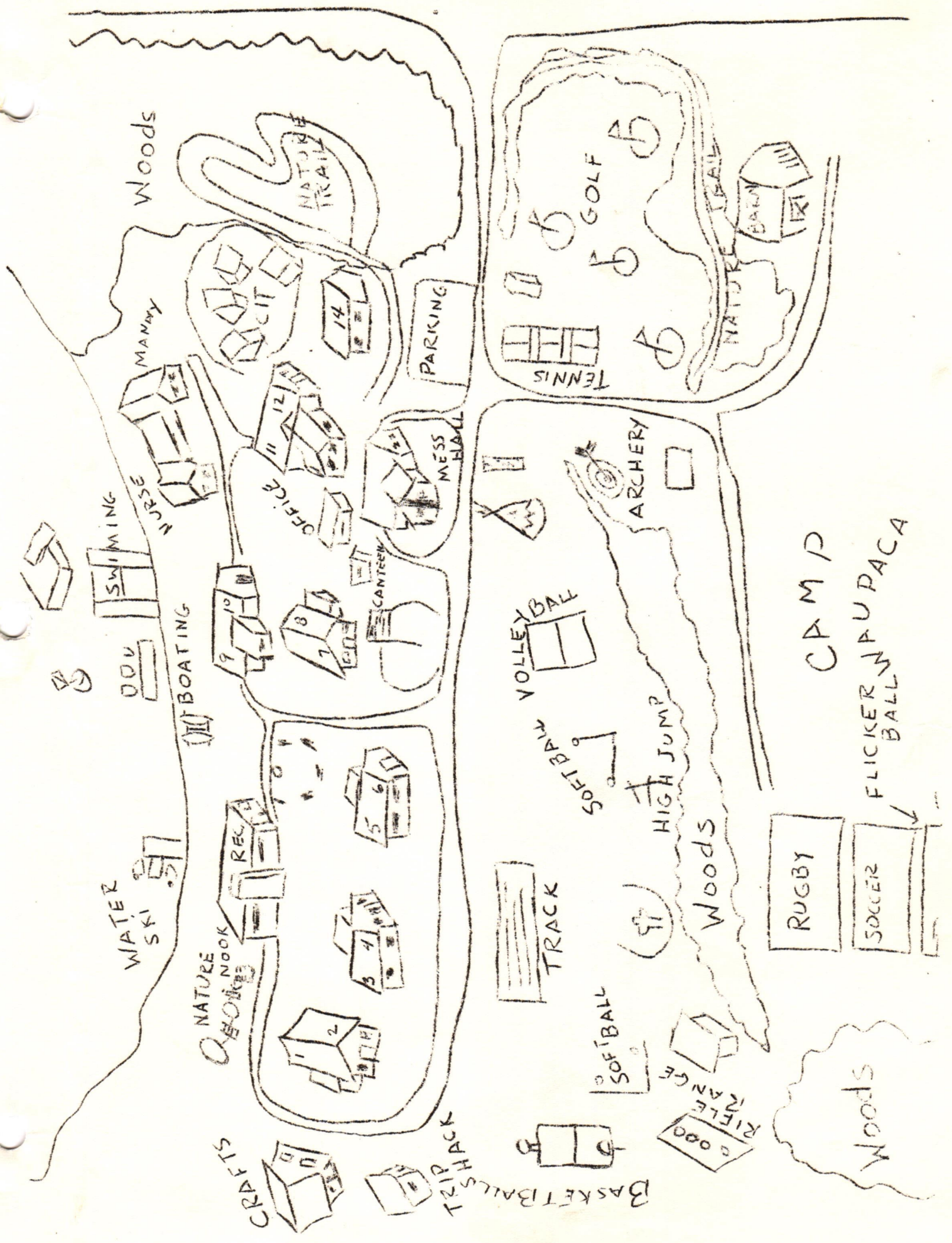
A GUIDE TO THE WAUPACA TRAILS, 1970
