

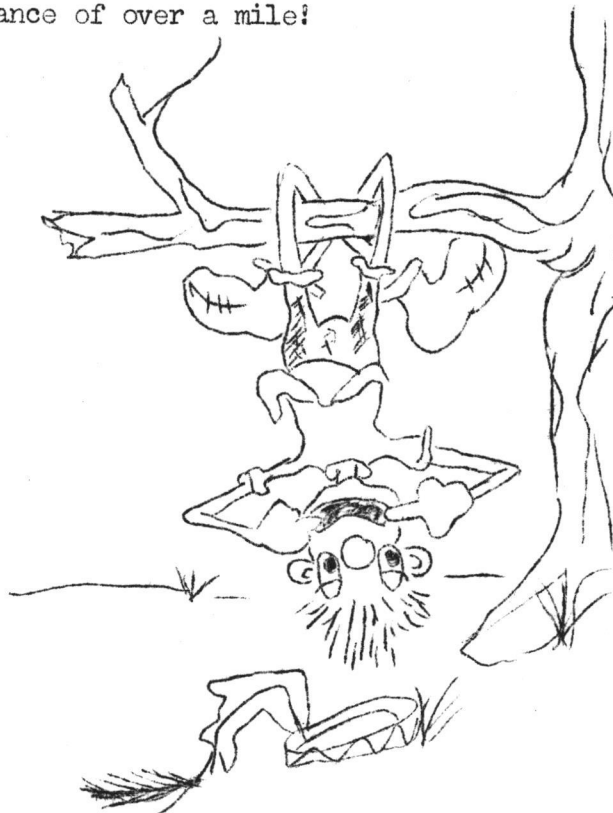


# CABIN REPORTS

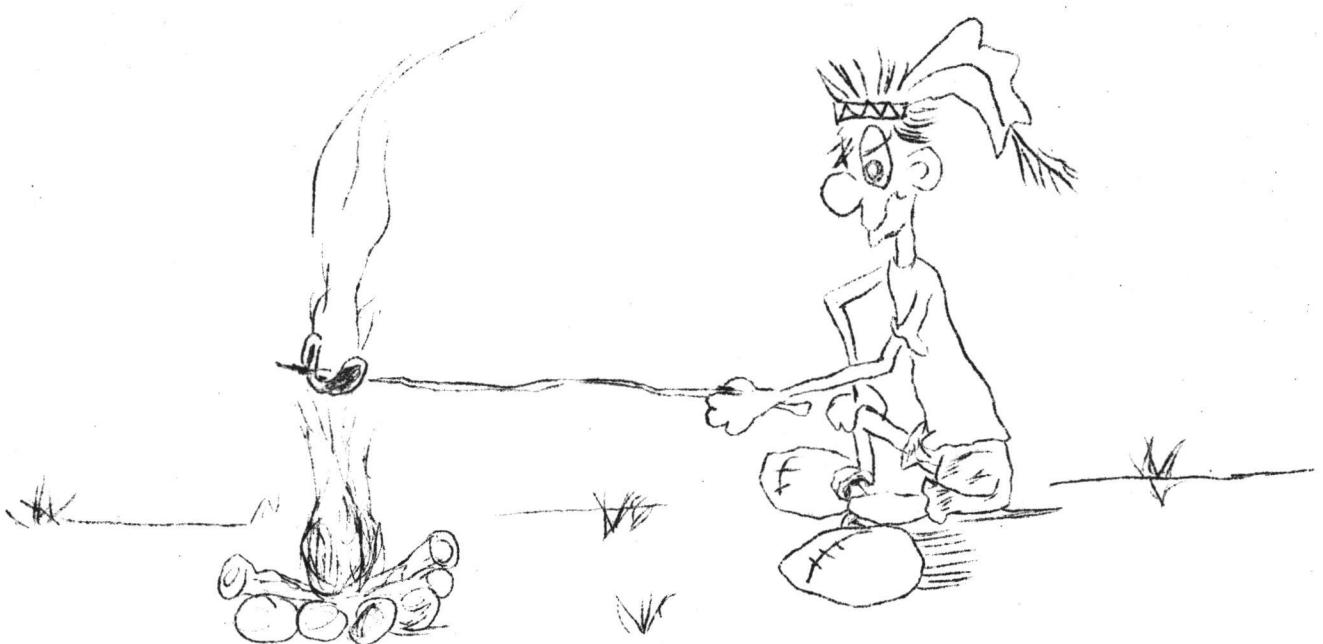
## CABIN 7

## CABIN 10

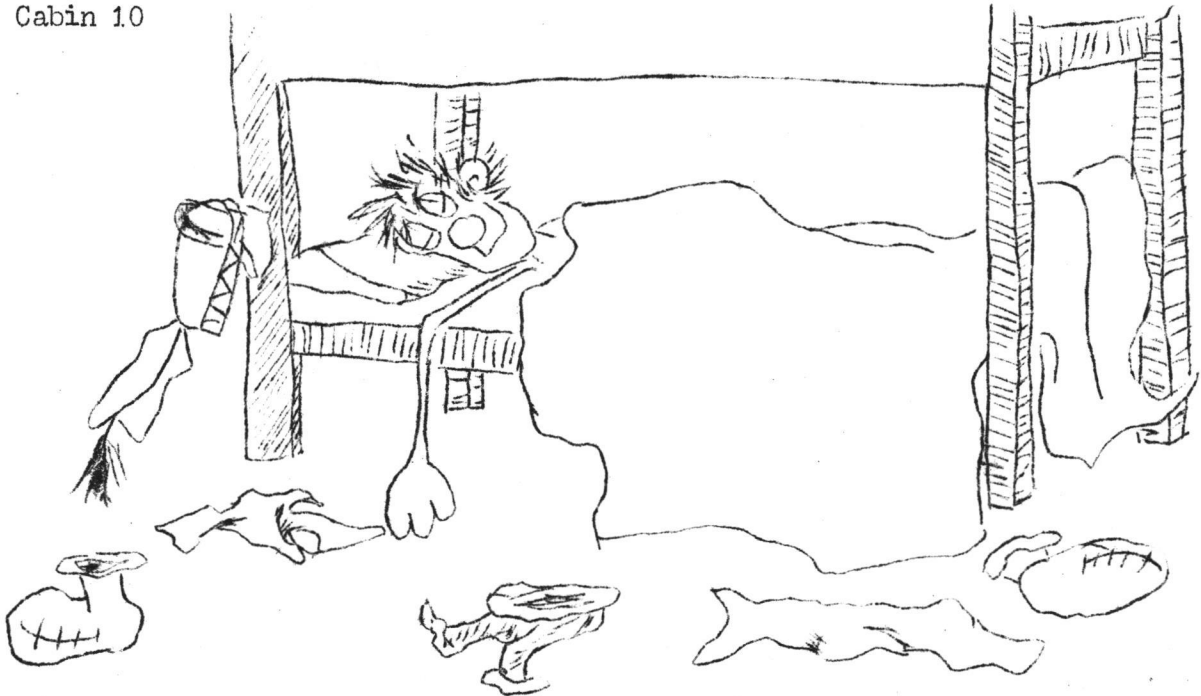
