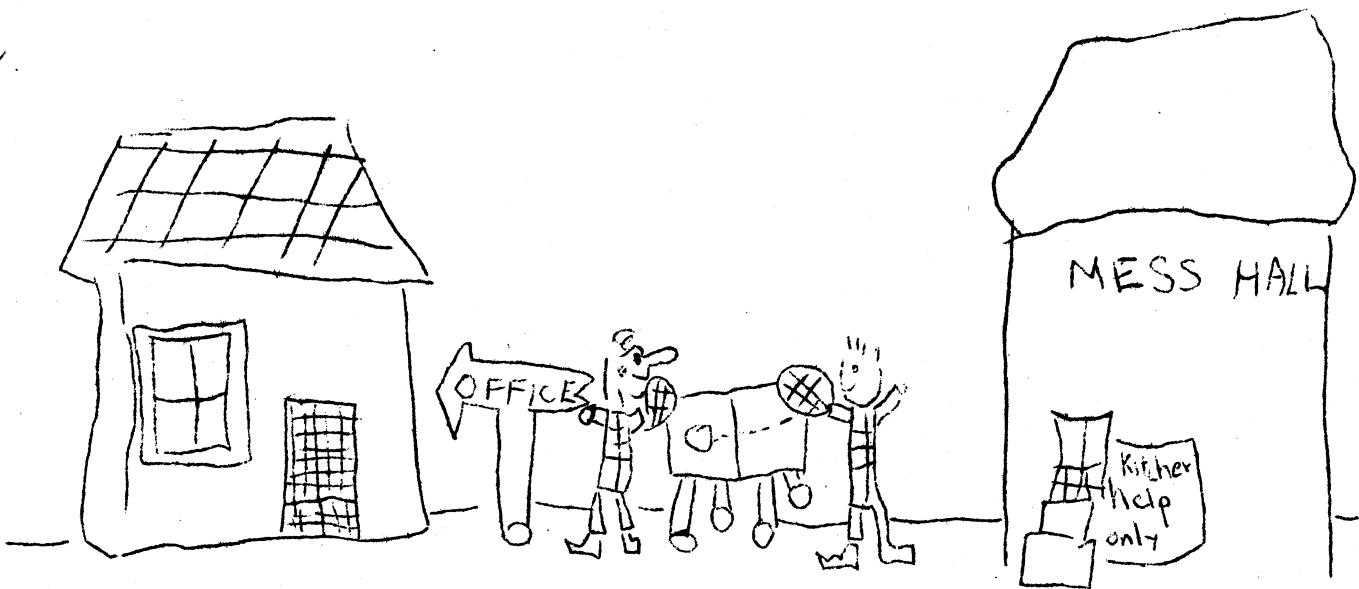
CABIN 2
