

The 1973 Camp Waupaca Olympics actually began several days before the flags were unfurled at the waterfront during the traditional opening ceremonies. Preparations for shirt designs and scheduling kept many members of the staff occupied for the greater part of the fourth week of camp. The silk screens used for printing the Olympic shirts were made by Jessie Clingingsmith once again this summer. The talents of Paul Warshauer once again enabled the Greek God Zeus to appear at the opening ceremonies. As Olympic runner Rich Trester completed the lighting of the torch on Friday morning, we were set for the finest and most competitive Olympics at camp in several years.

The opening event saw Ken Saunders and Randy Refkin win gold medals for USSR in the Marathon canoe competition. From that point on, Mike Chavin's USSR team took off on their way to the Olympic championship. Highlighting the first day of games were the gold medals won in two of the most difficult and demanding events scheduled during the 36 hours of Olympic competition. In the Track Pentathlon, winning the gold medal was Steve Taslitz of Israel; in the regular pentathlon, winning

the gold medal was Howard Gartzman of USA.

During the morning, competition consisted of individual events in small craft, golf and tennis, with junior team competition in riflery, archery and the Marathon Relay & Tri-Skill. The Friday afternoon activities were divided between the waterfront and the Basketball, Field Sports and Hockey preliminary matches. Evening activities on Friday included wrestling, the finals of the tennis elimination tournament, archery and the pre-liminary rounds of the junior basketball tournament. At the close of the first day, a special sportsmanship presentation by each team helped to set the tone of the closing ceremonies at the horseshoe campfire. Winning special recognition for their presentations were Mark Fishbein of France (gold), Jim Veltman of Israel (silver) and Bill Engerman of Japan (bronze).

The Saturday games were once again started with a march to the waterfront and an opening address by Paul Warshauer. Featured on Saturday morning were events in riflery, volleyball, linesoccer and one of the most exciting new events The All Nation Marathon. During the afternoon all of the team sports final matches were played just before the competition in track and field. The final events scheduled for the evening were postponed due to poor weather conditions, but the closing ceremonies in their place featured an additional event which may become a tradition for future Olympic competition. Each nation presented a closing statement in which they expressed their appreciation for the spirit that prevailed throughout all of the 1973 Olympic competition. Winning special recognition for their closing statements were Stan Friedell of Italy (gold), Jim Veltman of Israel (silver), and Coach Ray Krysh of USA (bronze). In all, the Olympics were closed in the same spirit with they were originally founded -- the true spirit of sportsmanship for the honor of country and the glory of sport.


