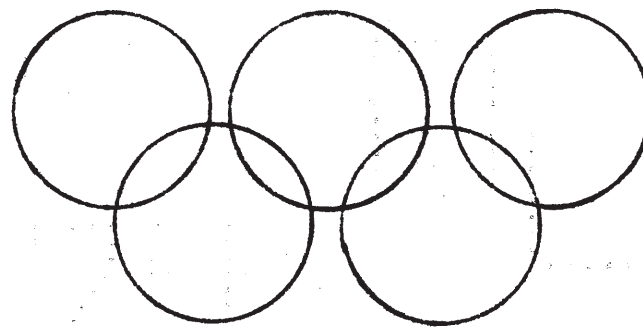

1974 OLYMPICS

The 1974 Olympics at Camp Waupaca was a great success for all who participated in the events and ceremonies. As the PA system sounded the Olympic theme during our march to the opening ceremonies, everyone could sense the beginning of a very special part of our camping summer.

Coach Ray Krysh and the USA emerged as the overall point champions, but all of the nations represented themselves as true champions in both spirit and achievement. Well over 300 medals were awarded during ceremonies in the Dining Hall. And with the presentation of each Gold medal, the sounding of a nation's national anthem gave a special feeling to each champion and all of his fellow countrymen.

Among the individual and team efforts which proved outstanding over the Olympic competition period, the most impressive achievements were turned in by Danny Parker with a gold medal in the Regular Pentathlon and Cary Goldberg & Mitch Goldman who split a gold medal in the Track Pentathlon. Paul Kole's amazing high jumping ability, the dominance of Italy's Rugby team, and many achievements too numerous to mention highlighted every moment of the Olympics. Our congratulations to all who participated!
