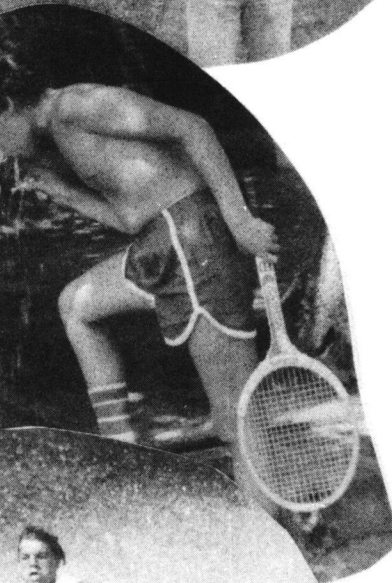

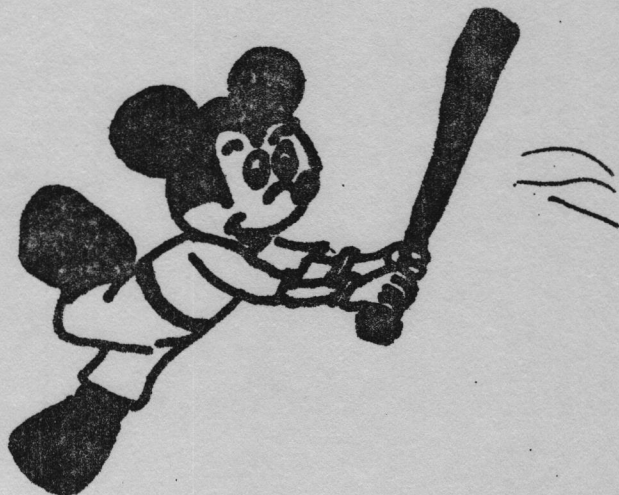

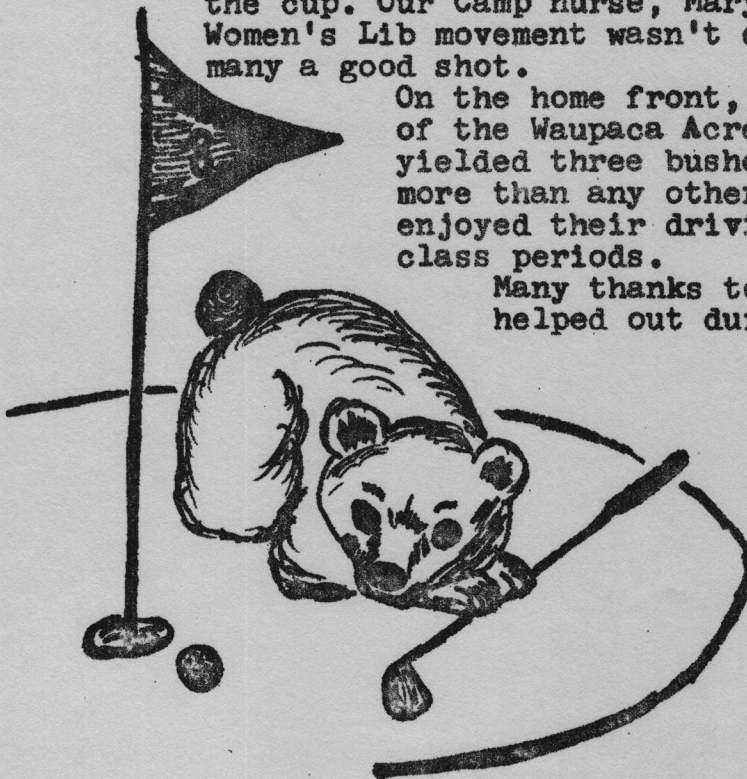
Golf

Many thanks to the CIT's who helped out during the summer.

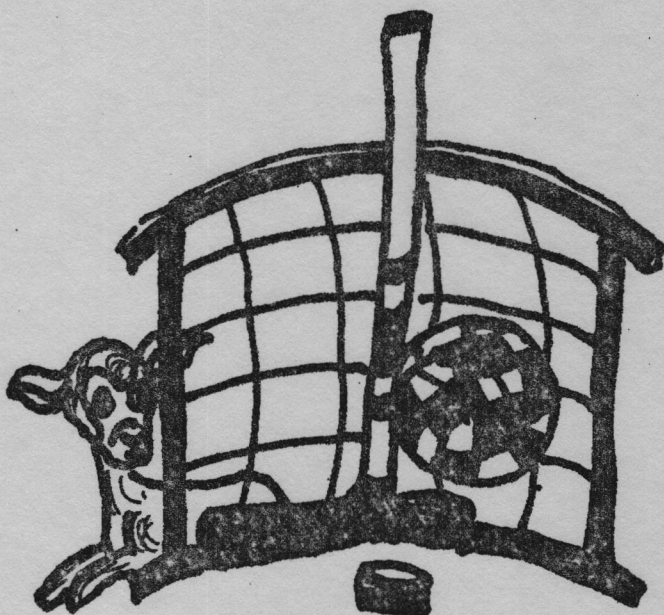

Horseback Riding

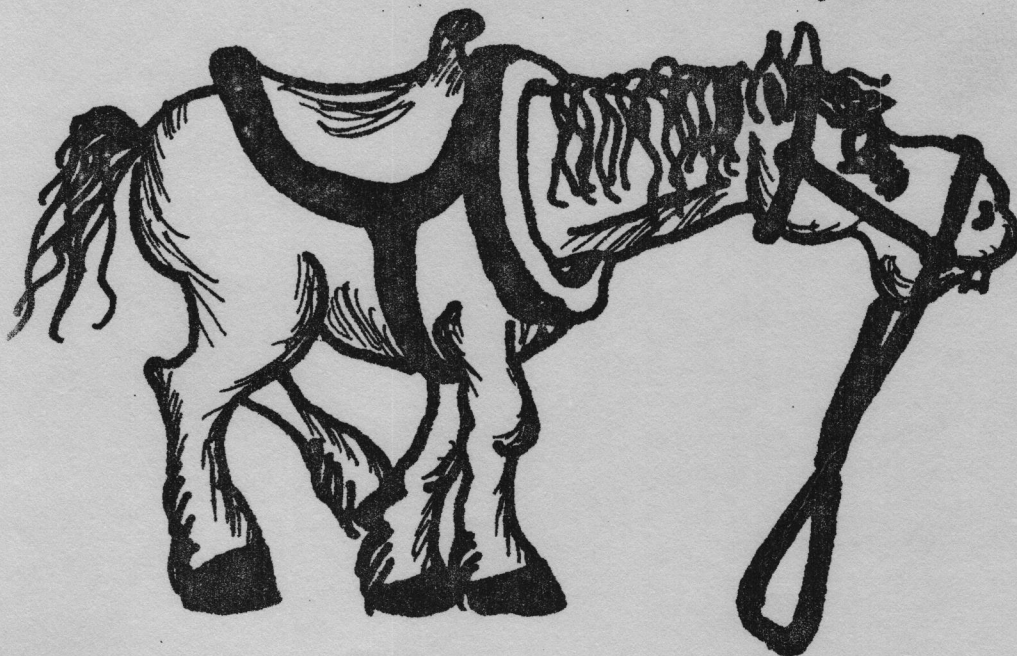

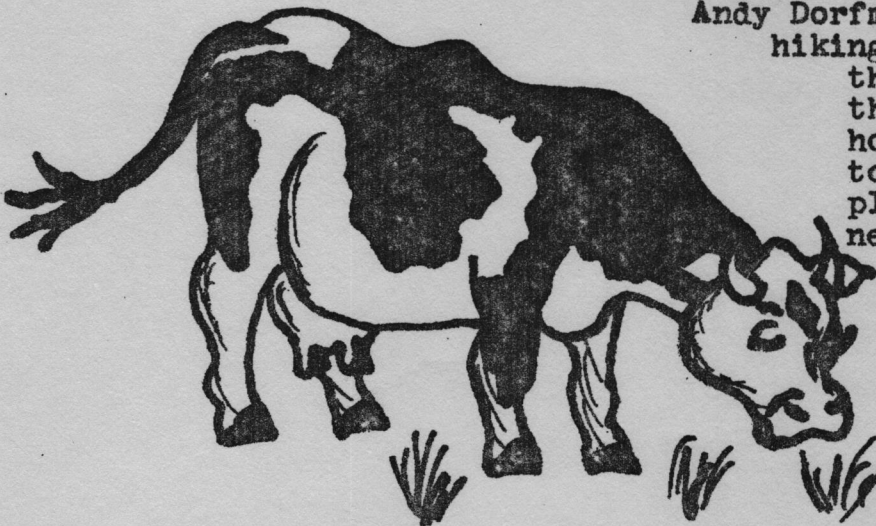

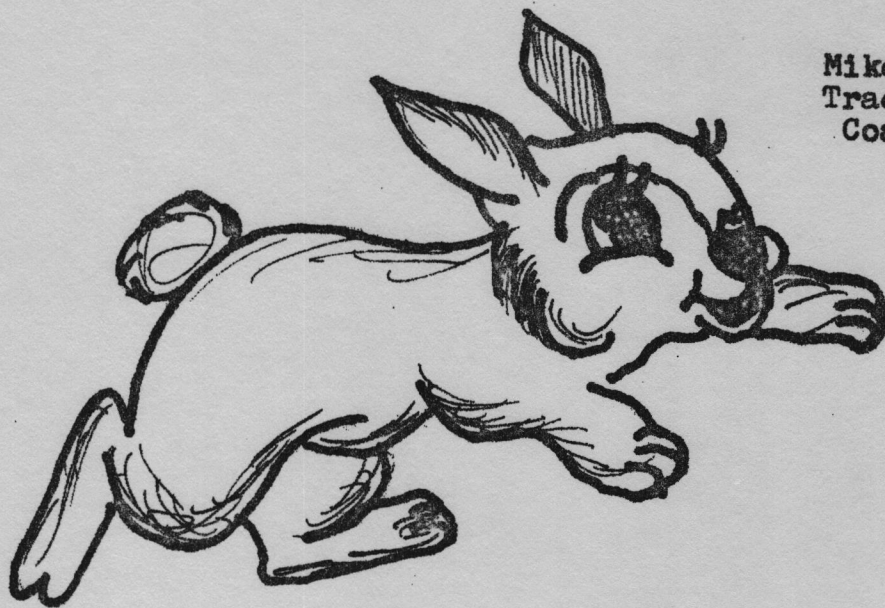
Track & Field

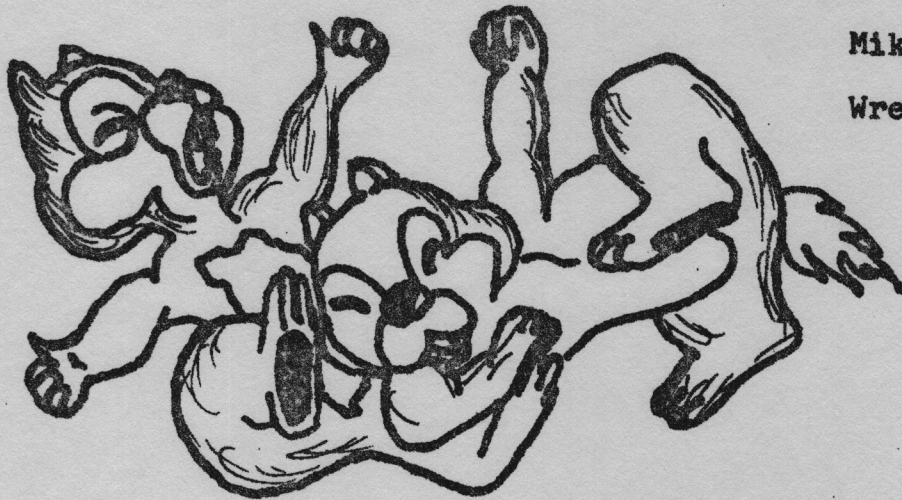
