

## RIDING






No sooner than the boys had arrived in camp and had their trunks unpacked than they were instructed to go to the waterfront swimming area where each campers swimming ability was individually evaluated and he was placed in one of the following classes: Basic Water Safety, Beginner, Advanced Beginner, Intermediate, Swimmer, or Junior Life Saver, (Basic Rescue and Water Safety).

Every camper in cabins 1-15 attended daily classes in swimming. Then those who desired, signed up for classes in waterskiing and boating. Fishing was done on a personal basis during free time.

The waterfront was extremely busy during the last four weeks as the temperatures soared higher dispelling any rememberance of Chicago's Blizzard of 1979. Campers and staff alike cooled off in Little Lake Stratton as they frolicked and swam in the deliciously cool, spring-fed waters.

During free time everyone enjoyed the equipment down at the waterfront: The slide in the swim area, innertubes in the beginners area, plastic jugs, spoons, cups, and plenty of imagination on the beach, as castles and forts were designed and created in the sand. 

#### ADVANCED BEGINNER SKILLS

To pass swimmers had to demonstrate reasonable aptitude in rhythmic breathing, survival floating, (2 minutes), treading water, (30 seconds) & changing positions, elementary backstroke, (25 yards), Crawl stroke, (25 yards), diving and unerwater swimming, (15 feet), use of personal flotation device, safety & rescue, first combined skills, second combined skills.

To pass intermediate swimming, campers had to do the following: scissors kick, (20 yards), crawl kick, (20 yards) breast stroke kick, (20 yards), side stroke arms, (10 yards), crawl stroke arms, (10 yards), breast stroke arms, (10 yards), elementary back stroke (50 yards), elementary back stroke arms (10 yards) selected stroke, (100 yards), survival float (5 min.), treading water, (one minute), floating (1 minute), underwater swimming (15 feet), standing front dive, rescue skills, and five minute swim.

Camp Waupaca's tennis program was simple, but educational to all campers. There were no actual lessons given to the group leaving the time to be spent on individual assistance to


many campers.

With all things considered campers learned more about tennis this year and most importantly, enjoyed themselves to the utmost.




### TRACK


