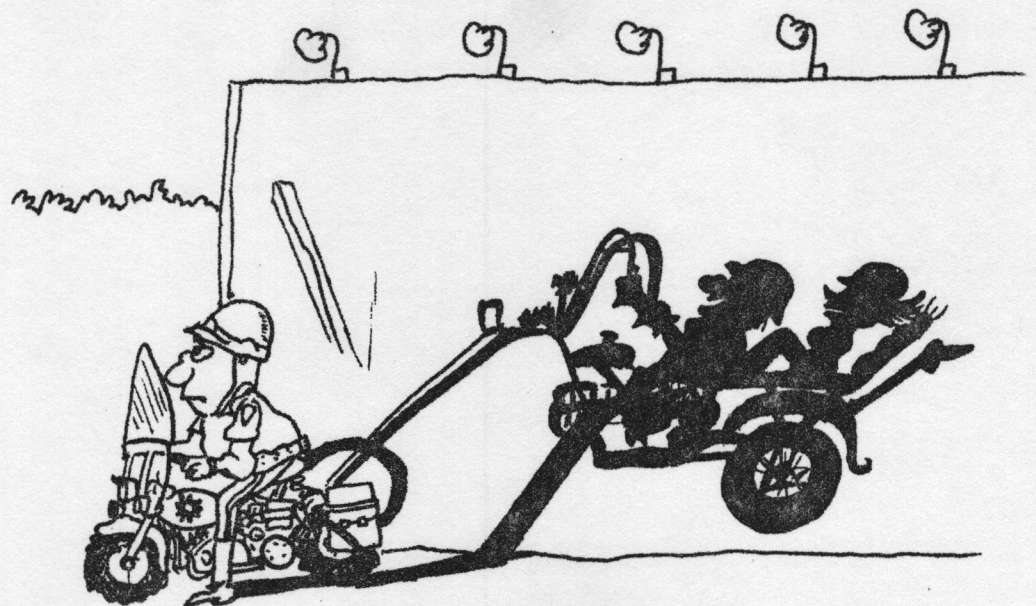
MINI-BIKES

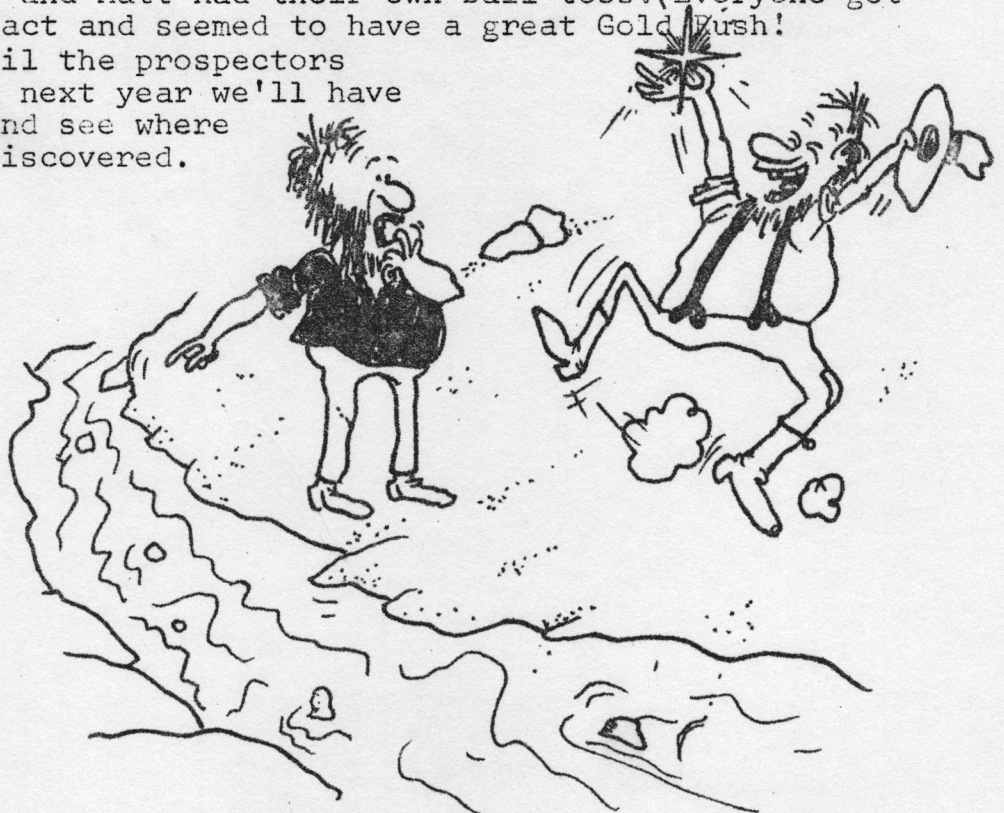

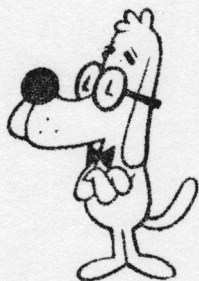

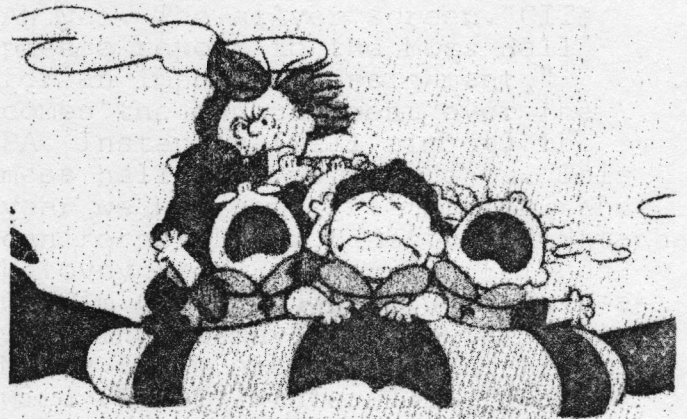


MOVIES
