

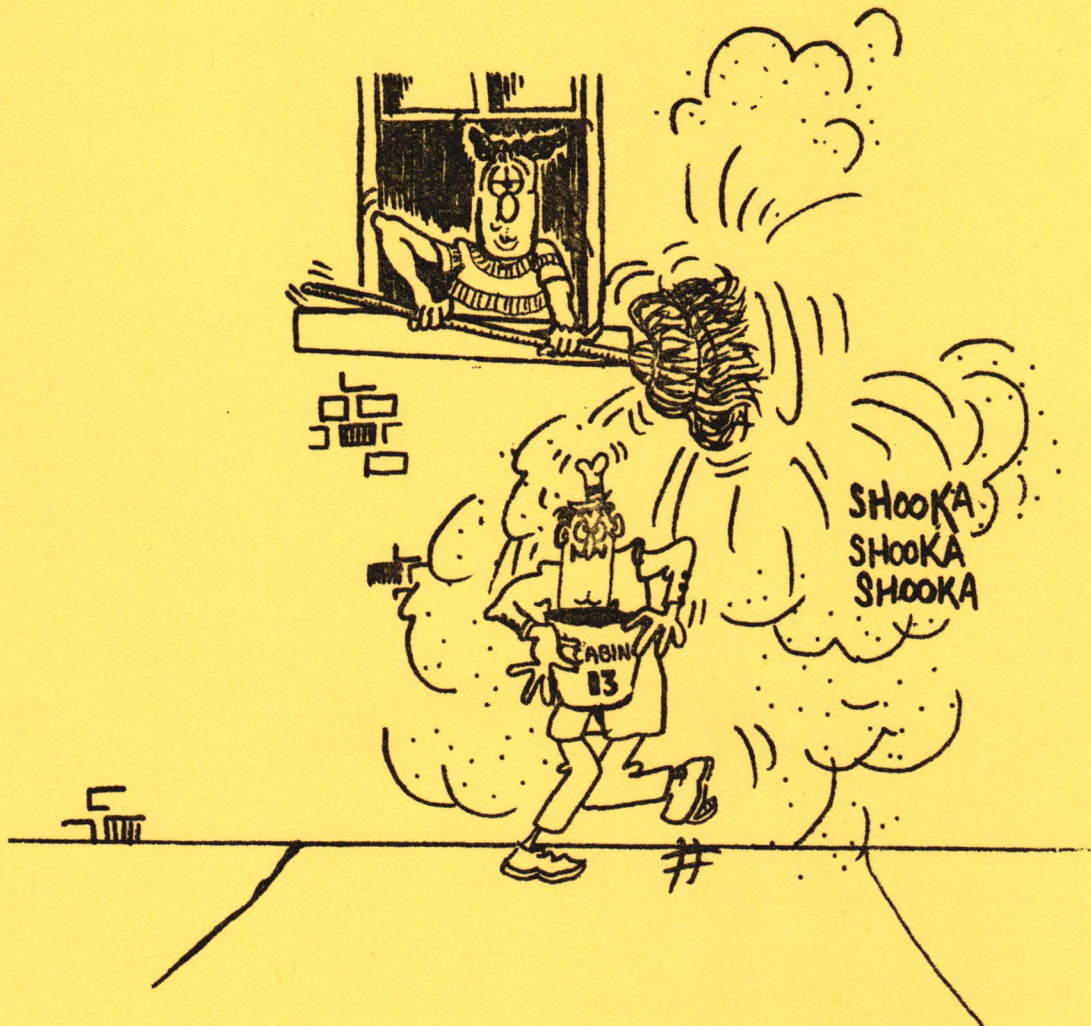
GOOD FUN
