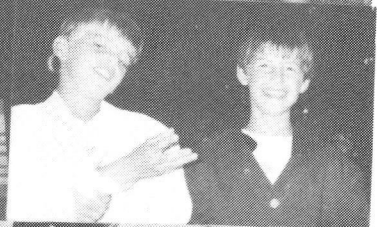
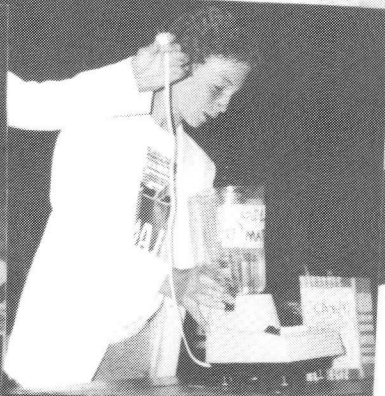
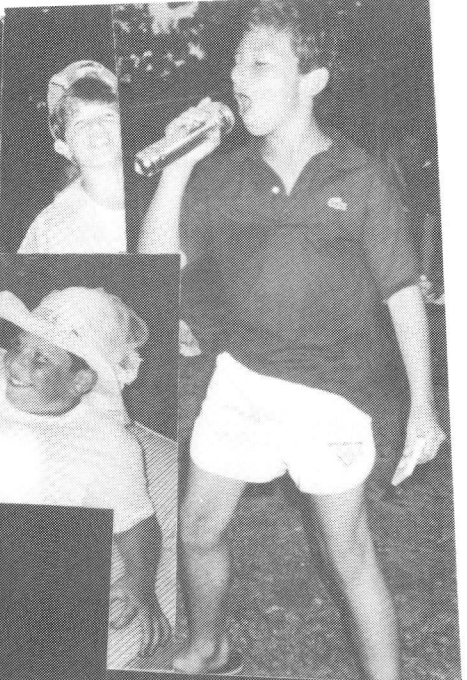

The year was full of talent that was all enjoyed by the audience. After all, where else can you play to a "sold out" house every time?

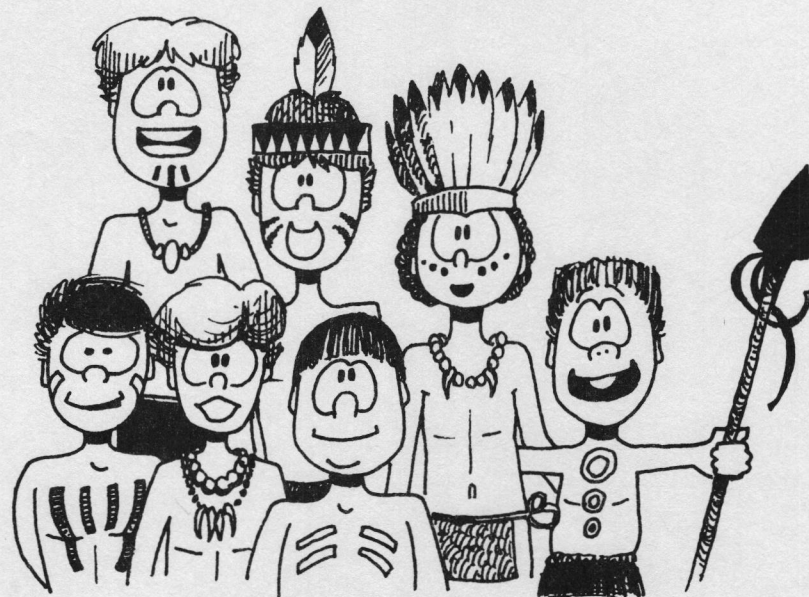


# SAGAMORE NITE

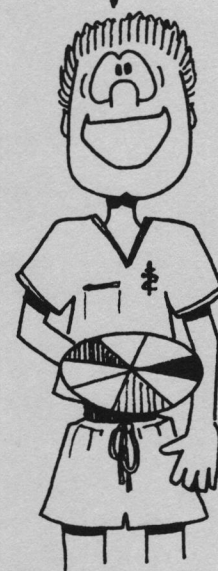

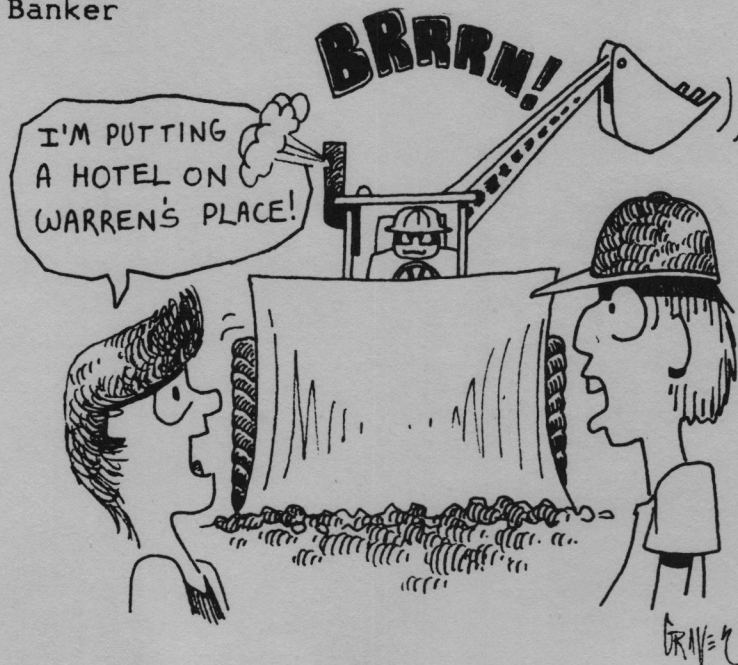

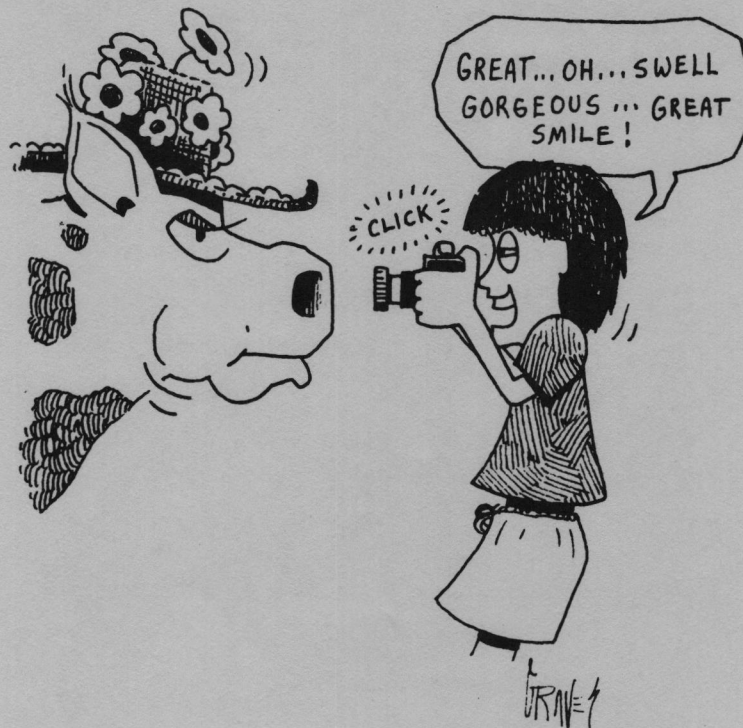
