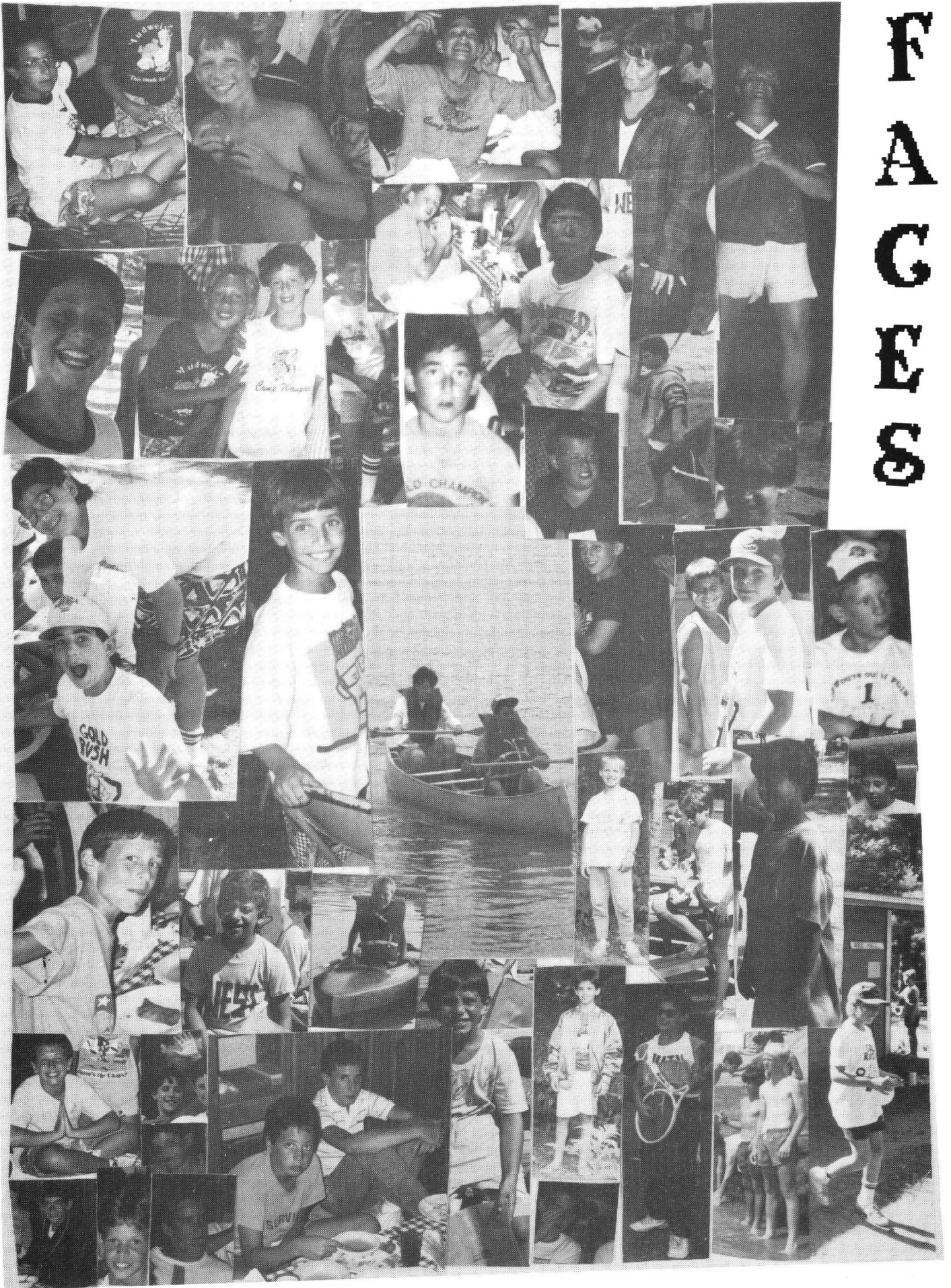


# FACES

This camping season is over but all that the guys talk about is coming back to Camp Waupaca again and again.

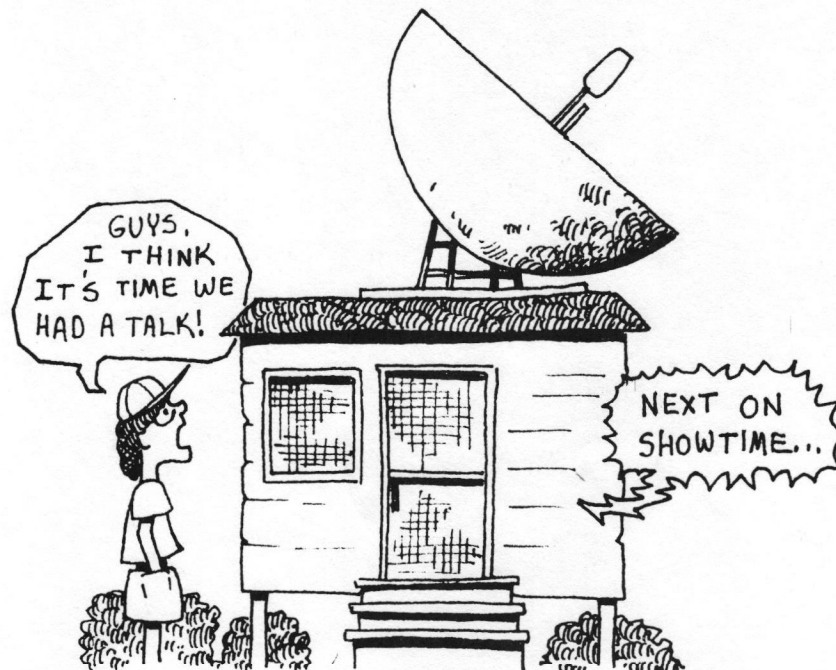
## CABIN 2
